The Cyberspace Law & Policy Centre at the UNSW Faculty of Law<sup>1</sup> is holding a one day Symposium on 2 October 2008 to consider the Australina Law Reform Commission's *Report on Privacy*, which will have been tabled in Parliament by September, and the NSW Law Reform Commission's privacy review which may also be finalised by then.

The theme of the Conference/Symposium will be to consider how well the ALRC and NSWLRC recommendations meet a number of current privacy challenges, including:

- Providing a set of Privacy Principles that set a new global standard
- Building consumer trust in electronic commerce
- Meeting international standards to facilitate appropriate cross border data transfers
- Delivering effective enforcement of privacy rules and remedies for breaches
- Limiting the growth of a surveillance society

Speakers will include:

- Professors David Weisbrot and/or Les McCrimmon, ALRC
- Professor Michael Tilbury, NSWLRC
- Federal, State and Territory Privacy Commissioners
- Private sector and NGO stakeholders

The event will be structured around panel sessions with a small number of presentations and an emphasis on dialogue and discussion.
